After graduating from the Moscow Architectural Institute with honours in 1997 he received a highly prestigious Chevening Scholarship for postgraduate study in the UK. He also received a special Queen's Award announced personally by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

He completed his Master's Degree in the Bartlett School of Architecture and shortly afterwards joined Richard Rogers Partnership. His first project at RRP was Madrid Airport - winner of the 2006 Stirling Prize - the most prestigious award in British architecture.

Since then Andrei has been involved in many of the practice's high-profile projects in the UK, Europe, USA, Asia and Australia.

In 2002-04 Andrei worked on Mossbourne Community Academy as

a project architect. After successful completion Andrei was promoted to an Associate position in RRP.

In 2004-06 he was involved in the design of 300 New Jersey Avenue project in Washington DC, USA. In 2005-06 he was permanently based in the USA overseeing the design.

In early 2006 Andrei joined Foster + Partners to work on the Russia Tower in Moscow City in the position of an Associate Partner. Upon completion of the project, he left F+P and joined Johnson Naylor - a boutique interior design practice specialising in residential sector.

In 2008 he returned to RRP (RSHP) to lead the practice's projects in Russia. After the financial crisis of 2008 the projects he has worked on have mainly been based in Australia.

In 2011 he established Lacey & Saltykov Architects in London with Tom Lacey. Their first completed project was a new-build pair of semi-detached houses in Wimbledon. The houses have been published in the national and international press and are award winning.

They have recently completed their second project, a new house in Cornwall.

The practice has worked on a diverse range of projects from new offices to university buildings. Following their success in a limited competition for Wimbledon College of Art they are now part of the framework of consultants for UAL.

Recent commissions range from a new 300,000 sq ft office building in Farringdon to a new house in Wimbledon.
